Strategic Planning Process

Meeting 2

Developing a Vision for the South Harrison Township School District.

On Saturday, January 26, 2019, South Harrison Township School District board members, administrators, education staff, parents and community members, twenty-six (26) in all, met to continue the strategic planning process for the school. The second meeting focused on developing a vision for the South Harrison Township School District. The meeting began with a welcome from the facilitator, Terri Lewis, New Jersey School Boards Association (NJSBA), to the members who participated in Session 1 and have returned and to new members joining the group process.

We recapped the outcomes of Session 1 and reminded everyone of the consensus process utilized in strategic planning. We then moved to discussing the topic for the evening; creating a shared vision for the south Harrison Township School District. Participants were asked to picture themselves 3 years into the future and seeing their school district on the cover of TIME magazine, with the caption "Schools that Succeed". The participants were asked to envision what was written in the Time magazine article that warranted such high recognition. In addition to the current programs already in place in the South Harrison Township School District, what programs / services / curriculum / student outcomes / best practices / facilities would you expect to see in your school? Participants were encouraged to think "big picture."

The information that follows is a summary of the work of the small groups. As discussed with the meeting participants, all consensus points are recorded to share the group work with everyone during the course of the strategic planning process.
