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
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Big-Picture Background

- 2010 Common Core State Standards adopted by NJ
- 2013-14 Shared curriculum service w/Kingsway; no ELA curriculum at South Harrison; outdated programs
- 2014-2015 ELA curriculum/assessments developed based upon the model curriculum
- 2015 PARCC was administered in the state of NJ
- 2016 The ELA standards were revised in 2016 by NJ – now New Jersey Student Learning Standards (NJSLS); curriculum revisions made to note changes
